#### Representative Matters

- Obtained a ruling from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit that an ERISA plan properly found a disability caused by fibromyalgia and chronic fatigue was encompassed within the self-reported symptom provision of the plan
- Successfully tried a jury-waived case which determined the insurer correctly found that a disability was caused by a psychiatric, not a neurologic, condition
- Obtained a ruling on behalf of an insurer from the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts, in a case of first impression, requiring an insured to receive appropriate care as a prerequisite for receiving disability benefits
- Represented an insurer before the Massachusetts Appeals Court to establish standard of proof for rescission of life insurance policies for fraudulent misrepresentation
- Represented an insurer responding to civil investigative demand from Massachusetts Attorney General and Division of Insurance regarding broker compensation, including managing a significant and complex document production
- Represented a disability insurer before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit in establishing the standard of review in ERISA benefit claim determinations
